## **SUMMARY:**

Twelve-year-old Amy Treloar is tired of being held responsible for her eleven-year-old sister Louann, who is a student at the Stadler School for Exceptional Children. When her Aunt Clare returns home to live temporarily in Amy's great-grandparents huge old house, Amy see this as an opportunity to escape Louann, at least for a short while.

While staying with Aunt Clare, Amy finds a magnificent dollhouse in the attic, one that is a perfect miniature of the old house. On subsequent visits to the attic, Amy finds that a wall of the dollhouse slides open and closed, the dolls move around and cry, lights turn on and off, and books fall.

Eventually the actions in the dollhouse help Aunt Clare solve the mystery of who killed her grandparents thirty years earlier.

#### **QUESTIONS:**

Do you believe that, no matter what the problem is, truth will eventually be revealed? How and why does Amy's relationship with Louann begin to change?

What would you do if you discovered something mysterious that you just couldn't explain? Do you think Aunt Clare will be able to keep a steady job and enjoy life more when she returns to Chicago?

What changes do you think Mr. and Mrs. Treloar could make that would help Louann?
