SUMMARY:

Steven Alper leads a hectic eighth grader's life, trying to keep up with school work, playing the drums in the school band, and obsessing about the hottest girl in school. To top it off, he has a kindergarten brother, Jeffrey, who asks too many questions and gets on his nerves. When Jeffrey is diagnosed with leukemia, Steven's life becomes a roller coaster ride that is almost all down hill. Family and friends, though, show what they're made of as they struggle and support one another.

QUESTIONS:

How did this story originate? How does Steven's role within the family change after his brother his diagnosed with leukemia? In what ways do Steven's parents react differently to Jeffrey's sickness? How does Steven support Jeffrey during his sickness? Why do you think Steven's father does not go to the hospital with Jeffrey and their mother? Why does Steven not want to tell kids at school about Jeffrey's illness? Why is Steven so angry? Describe one time when Steven "changes the things he can." Is Steven right to tell his parents that they don't have to pay for drum lessons anymore? Why does Samantha tell Steven to always be there for his brother? How does the band show support? How is each character's life been changed by Jeffrey's illness?

Research the current statistics and progress being made on curing children with leukemia. Find out what agencies exist in your neighborhood that could support a family who is having a difficult time dealing with disease.

Ask a drummer to perform for your group.

Write a recipe for your own version of "Dangerous Pie."

Steven Alper is an eighth grader who goes through life with one significant challenge: Read page 4---from "Having a brother is horrible" through "...he also destroys all of my stuff, including my self-esteem and sanity."

When 5 year old Jeffrey is diagnosed with leukemia, though, it all turns around. His mother can only concentrate on Jeffrey, his father becomes distant, yet Steven still has to focus on normal, eighth grade stuff---like girls and drums and (you'll have to figure out the dangerous pie part!)
